
Important Notes:

Turpin Loop 46

Route Description

This route meaders through King William County, staying mostly south of Route 30 (King William Highway). Evently, the route arrives in Aylett with a store stop (with a rest room) at KJ's Market on Route 360. Most of the route is quite rural with light traffic, although the route includes two legs on Route 30 and two very short legs on Route 360 at Aylett. As always, riders should be extra cautious on Route 30 and Route 360. Both roads are busy, fast and not particiulary bike friendly. The route name is named the Turpin loop because it passes through a rural area of King William County called Turpin. Turpin is near the intersection of Venter Road and Route 30 around around mile 29. The area was named after Dr. John O. Turpin, a well know 19th century King William preacher who is burried at Beulah Church.
