

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Route Description

This route follows the Route 301 coordinator north into central Caroline County, then crosses over into King William County and then back into Hanover for the return to the Hanover Courthouse. The route name is based on the fact that the route includes portions of two different "River Roads." One is King William and one in Hanover. Most of the route is quite rural with light traffic, although the route includes a few miles on Route 301 and two crossings of Route 30 (be careful!). There is a steep hill on Smokey but, thankfully, it is not very long. Once you pass the 600 Market around mile 11, there are no more stores for the remainder of the route. So, carry plenty of water.
